### **Individual Spiritual Direction**

Spiritual Direction is a confidential relationship which aims at assisting a person to experience God in the present moment and serves to review one's experiences of God in light of beliefs, relationships, values and attitudes. More than "direction" this is a time of spiritual conversation and companionship. The Holy Spirit breathes in the midst of the conversation as a discerning guide.

In the Spiritual Direction Relationship:

- The focus is on the spiritual life: awakenings, growth in relating with God, oneself and others; modes of prayer; fidelity in the "night" or in times of suffering; discerning how to make choices and changes in life directions and decisions
- Various dynamics of conversion may occur: curiosity, conversation, inquiry, perhaps even a change in attitudes of mind and heart
- · Time, trust and truthfulness are required.
- Respectful attention is given to moments of contemplation/awareness and discernment/ decision-making

One would hope that a spiritual director would serve to provide (to use the metaphor of William Butler Yeats) a "transparent lamp around a spiritual flame."

In spiritual direction, it is especially important to speak about what is going on in one's prayer. In times of pain, disappointment, or crisis, it is important to ask: Where do I find God in all this? What is God saying to me through this experience?

## New Retreat Directors! New Prayer Opportunities! New Chances for God to Walk with You!

We are very excited about several priests who will give retreats at the Palisades for the first time this year. Fr. Bryan Dolesji, Fr. John Whitney and Fr. Gary Lazzeroni should all make excellent retreat directors. Another addition is a five day women's retreat during Advent. One can come just for the week-end of Dec. 17-19 or stay through the 21st. There will also be two new faith-sharing retreats for men. one in January and one during Lent. For private retreats, one can now stay in the cottage or the main house. With three rooms in the cottage, it provides a private space for families or friends who might want to come on retreat together. While it is almost always possible to find room for a private retreat, you should inquire about dates at least two weeks in advance. More time may be needed to schedule if Spiritual Direction is desired. Cost of private retreats vary based on length of stay and services required. Private retreats allow time for prayer, rest and reflection without large group presentations. And, just this month, we have added a labyrinth on our grounds for another type of prayer experience. Material is available at the Palisades to assist you in walking the labyrinth if this is your first time or even if you've walked this path in other places.

When you call the retreat center, please state that you wish to make a private retreat so that we can check the calendar for room availability.


