Camp Don Bosco

The natural setting of Don Bosco includes hiking trails, playing fields, swimming pool, archery range, craft shop, two chapels one traditional-building and one outdoor, challenge course, and more. If this is your first or fifth time at camp, our highly trained staff will help you feel right at home.

Culinary Camp Junior (Grades 3-5)

Specifically geared toward our younger chefs, you will practice cooking delicious dishes, learn kitchen safety, and make your own recipe book to take home! Always a favorite, be sure to sign up early!

Mini-Camp (Grades 1-2)

All the fun in half the time! This is a great introduction to Classic camp.

Make new friends, explore the trails, swim in the pool, roast marshmallows, hands on faith activities and lots more!

Classic (Grades 3-5)

Don Bosco's traditional camping experience. Campers who choose "Classic" can look forward to days full of fun: meeting new friends, exploring the woods, swimming, arts and crafts, archery, cooking out, singing around the campfire, growing in faith and much more!

OLS Junior (Grades 3-5)

Spend a few hours each day increasing your outdoor skills and gaining a new appreciation for God's creation. Learn the art of making a perfect campfire build a shelter, learn how to tie knots, and prepare food over the campfire. This program prepares participants for Tatonka, Nanamakee, and is an ideal choice for those in scouting.

Trail Scouts (Grades 3-5)

DAY CAMP

JUNIOR HIGH PROGRAMS

(Grades 6-8)

Hamilton

(Grades 6-9)

Camp Hamilton sits on 570 acres of forest and an 80- acre lake, in Monroe, WA. Swimming and boating on the lake, archery, hiking, climbing the wall, and experiencing our high ropes courses are just some of the adventures you and your cabin mates help choose. At night, sing around the campfire, sleep under the stars or go on a night hike. You'll have a week full of fun, prayer, and the sacraments.

Adventure Camp

Adventure awaits you with an exciting twist on traditional camp activities. Gain a new appreciation of God's creation through nature activities, camping skills and exploring camp.

Mountain Biking

Get ready for an exciting session rushing down trails and roads on a mountain bike. Learn the basics of safe riding while enjoying some great trails. Experienced counselors challenge campers to reach individual and group goals. Campers are divided into riding groups based on skill level. Campers must bring a bike and helmet to camp.

Wrangler

2 or more years experience (intermediate horse skills)

Immerse yourself in horsemanship and the cowboy lifestyle! Spend a week living in covered wagons and eating breakfast or lunch in a country-style shelter. Have a horse assigned to you for the week, and spend 2-3 hours per day improving your balance at the trot and lope, learning safe trail riding, and caring for the horses. Campers are assigned riding groups according to skill level. Boots with a ¾ - inch heel and smooth sole required.

Tatonka

Strengthen your camping skills, cook over an open fire, hike to the top of Mt. Stohr, learn about nature and each other away from main camp on a four day expedition you won't forget. These programs prepare participants for Nanamakee, CYO's teen expeditions. An equipment list will be sent with confirmation packages.

Hamilton

(Grades 9-12)

Adventure Camp

Amidst the rugged setting of Camp Hamilton, participate in an exciting and challenging experience designed specifically for high school students. Enjoy all that camp has to offer: swimming, boating, archery, rock climbing, horseback riding, high ropes, hiking, crafts, sundown and mystic overnight adventures! You help choose wake up, bed time, meal times, activities, and themes as a community. You'll form new friends, learn to work together and grow in faith through prayer experiences and the sacraments.

Nanamakee

(Grades 9-12)

Sail, Kayak, or Canoe the South Sound

Live an adventure with new friends while exploring the many islands and shorelines of the beautiful South Puget Sound. Whether you prefer paddling or wind power, we've got a trip for you! Take a kayak, the Big Canoe, or one of our sail boats to share laughter and faith in this small community of fellow high schoolers. Enhance your camping and water skills, as you spend a week making memories that will last a lifetime! Intermediate swimming skills required for all water trips (swim 100 yds, tread water for 1 minute).

Hike And Raft

Adventure begins in the beautiful backcountry of the Cascade Mountains. Learn to rely on each other and deepen your faith as you hike through God's country and camp out under the stars. End your week with heart-pounding thrills in a fun-filled white water rafting trip led by an experienced river guide.



LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Counselor-in-Training Program (Grades 10-12)

PRICING

CYO's goal has always been to provide an unparalleled experience and one where money is never a reason that a child cannot attend camp. In the past few years we used a three-tier pricing structure that enabled families to choose from subsidized fees if the full cost of camp would make the experience cost-prohibitive. This year, we are returning to a simplified fee structure. With one set fee, we are able to offer camp to everyone at what were tier-two prices while still covering all expenses. Financial Aid is available to offer assistance to families who could not otherwise afford to send a child to camp.

FINANCIAL AID

CYO is committed to making it possible for every young person to attend camp. To support that commitment, CYO has established a Campership Fund to offer aid to families who could not otherwise afford to send a child to camp. All families are encouraged to apply if help is needed. Varying amounts of aid are offered depending on need. The maximum scholarship available is \$300 per camper. If requesting financial aid, be sure to complete that section on the registration form. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required. CYO does accept donations to our campership fund.

DISCOUNTS

Multi-Child Families

\$50 off for each additional resident camper. This is a special offer for families interested in having more than one child attend resident camp during the summer of 2011. This offer does not apply to families receiving financial aid from CYO or to Day Camp. Applies to siblings or children who share a common guardian.

Multi-Session Discounts

\$50 off for each additional resident camp and \$25 for each additional Day Camp.

This applies to resident and day campers who attend more than one session per summer.

This offer does not apply to families receiving financial aid from CYO.
