We live in a vastly different world from the one of just fifty years ago. Our technological advances allow us to do things both good and bad that were not even thought of just a generation ago. It is our daily choice as to how to use the gifts of technology that surround us.

Prayer

How does technology make life easier today? Thank God in prayer for those things. How is modern technology used for sin? Even the rampant materialism and individual gratification that is promoted through the technological media can be sinful. Consider a prayer that asks God to let His will be done - or create a prayer of your own, which asks God's help in promoting technology for His purpose.

Formation

Consider how technology pertains to your personal and professional life. Are you being called to learn more about any forms of technology? Consider ways to ensure your knowledge of technology as it continually advances.

Hospitality

Think of the computer and your use of it. What are the opportunities to use it for good? How can you avoid using email or the internet in ways that are not pleasing to God, such as hurting others, albeit inadvertently? What ways could you use your computer to enhance other people's lives?

Service

There are many opportunities to use technology to help others. Consider tools available to you that God may want you to use for a special project or ministry.
