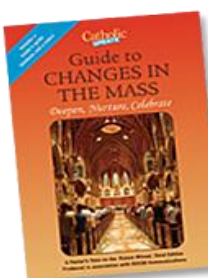

1. *Why is the Translation of the Mass Changing?* (Our Sunday Visitor) is a six panel pamphlet recommended for all teachers and catechists. It also is a good resource for parents and high school students.
The price for a package of 50 pamphlets is: \$11.



2. *The Mass at a Glance* (Our Sunday Visitor) is a laminated 8 ½ X 11 inch tri-fold that provides both the revised sections of the Mass as well as an overview of the history of the Mass, scriptural references and names for sacred vestments and parts of the Church. It is highly recommended for all catechists and teachers.
The cost is \$6 per item.



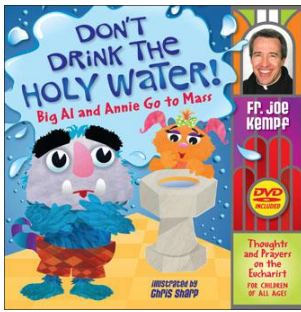
3. *Catholic Update Guide to the Mass* (St. Anthony Messenger Press) provides a series of short videos on a DVD, with reproducible handouts and a leader's guide. This resource is highly recommended for parishes and schools who would like to offer inservice training to the staff, parents, and parishioners.
The cost for this package is \$32.



4. Catholic Update also has two newsletters that are great handouts for middle and high school students, faculty and parents. They are:
 - *A Guide to the New Translation of the Roman Missal*
 - *Changing How We Pray*
 Each newsletter costs \$.25.



5. *The Mystery of Faith: A Study of the Structural Elements of the Order of the Mass* (Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions) is a "must-have" text for liturgical coordinators. It provides excellent liturgical catechesis on the Mass in a user-friendly format with discussion questions. It is strongly recommended that each school and parish have one copy.
The cost per copy will be \$15.



6. *Don't Drink the Holy Water* (Ligouri Press) is a book with accompanying DVD that is an excellent resource on the Mass for younger children. This book is recommended for all school and parish libraries.
The cost per book and DVD is \$14.



7. For those schools seeking an aid to assist students learning about the revised responses, the laminated Pew Card that accompanies the *Mass at a Glance* tri-fold is a durable and recommended educational item for classroom use.
A package of 50 laminated cards costs \$13.

This 90 page manual is designed for those catechizing children between Grades 4 – 8, with adaptations for teens on the Mass. It offers eight very comprehensive lesson plans on the Mass and the various sections of the Mass. It is strongly recommended that all schools and parishes review this wonderful resource for use during the upcoming school year.

Recommended Materials and Purchasing Information :

(Note: Although we recommend these resources, they will not be available for order through OCF. However, all items are available for loan through the Archdiocesan Library Media Center.)

- *Understanding the Revised Mass Texts (2nd Edition)* by Paul Turner (Liturgy Training Publications) is recommended for teachers and catechists. Each participant manual costs \$1.25 and the Leader's Guide for catechetical leaders is \$8.95 plus s/h with discounts available for larger orders.
- *Family Poster of the Mass* is recommended as an item to send home with elementary students for family discussions on the Mass and the revised Roman Missal. This product is from Our Sunday Visitor and costs \$7.95 for a package of 10 posters plus s/h, unless ordered before 6/30.
- *At the Supper of the Lamb: A Pastoral and Theological Commentary on the Mass* by Paul Turner (Liturgy Training Publications) is for those working on liturgical commissions or seeking to deepening their understanding of the structure of the Mass. The book is 163 pages of information and reflection questions and costs \$16.95 plus s/h.
- *The Mass* by Cardinal Wuerl and Mike Aquilina (Doubleday Religion) is an excellent foundational resource for anyone seeking to deepen their understanding of the Mass. The book is \$21.99 plus s/h. Discounts are available for large orders.
- *The Mass in Scripture: Lectio Divina Bible Study* by Stephen Binz (Our Sunday Visitor) explore the Biblical roots of the new translation of the Roman Missal. It is written in a format that could be used either for personal reflection or small group formation. It costs \$9.95 plus s/h, although discounts might be available for ordering 10+ copies.
- *My Mass Book* (Our Sunday Visitor) is a 24 page booklet for early elementary children on the parts of the Mass and their responses with the revised Roman Missal. However, only one Eucharistic prayer is included in this booklet. The book costs \$3.50 plus s/h.
- *Mystical Body and Mystical Voice* by Christopher Carstens and Fr. Douglas Martis (Liturgy Training Publications) offers a comprehensive sacramental catechesis using a combination of 7 hours of DVD/ videos , CD PowerPoint, participant textbook and Leader's Guide. The full package costs \$125, with additional participant textbooks costing \$16.95 and \$3 for Leader's Guides.
- *Preparing Parish Liturgies: A Guide to Resources* (Liturgy Press) is recommended for those preparing school and parish liturgies. The book costs \$24.95 plus s/h.
- *What's New About the Mass: Teaching Edition* (Liturgy Training Publications) offers one teacher handbook for children and another for teens. These guides would be helpful for teachers and catechists preparing their own lesson plans on the Roman Missal. Please note the accompanying workbooks for children and teens are NOT recommended for purchase. Each teacher guide costs \$8.95 plus s/h.
- *Lifting Up Your Heart: Praying with the Third Edition of the Roman Missal* (Renew International) <http://www.renewintl.org>. This is a good small faith sharing guide for parents groups, parish catechists and school staff.
