



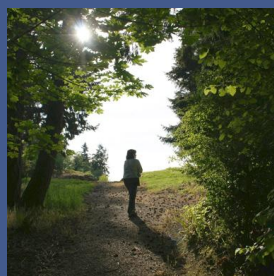

The Theology of the Body is a study of life, love, and the human person in the context of God's eternal plan for salvation. Between the years of 1979 and 1984, Pope John Paul II dedicated his first 129 Wednesday audiences to the teachings of Christ and the Catholic Church in regards to the real meaning of love and God's plan for human relationships.

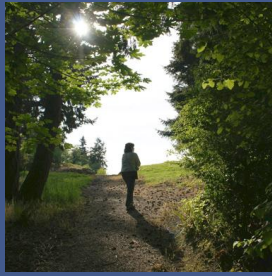
