Episode 5: The Indispensible Men: Peter, Paul, and the Missionary Adventure


Episode 6: A Body both Suffering and Glorious - The Mystical Union of Christ and the Church

The Human Person: According to John Paul II (Book) Bransfield, J. Brian, Pauline Books & Media, 2010. In the 20th Century three social revolutions--the industrial, sexual and technological revolutions--challenged the religious convictions of many. John Paul II's teaching on the theology of the body was his response to the resulting societal shifts. In this volume, Fr. Bransfield explores John Paul's response to the challenges raised by these revolutions. In this context Bransfield then explores how TOB leads us to live the fullness of the Christian life. (S,A)

God and the Founders: Madison, Washington, and Jefferson (Book) Muñoz, Vincent Phillip, Cambridge University Press, 2009. Did the Founding Fathers intend to build a 'wall of separation' between church and state? Are public Ten Commandments displays or the phrase 'under God' in the Pledge of Allegiance consistent with the Founders' understandings of religious freedom? In God and the Founders, Dr Vincent Phillip Muuoz answers these questions by providing comprehensive interpretations of James Madison, George Washington, and Thomas Jefferson. By analyzing Madison's, Washington's, and Jefferson's public documents, private writings, and political actions, Muñoz explains the Founders' competing church-state political philosophies. (S,A)

Guide for Sacristans Turner, Paul (Book) Liturgy Training Publications, 2011. A basic theological and historical overview of the ministry. Effective for training those new to the ministry and for rejuvenating the work of veterans, the book can be used by individuals or groups. It gives all sacristans the background and tools they need to pray, study, and serve in the liturgy. This second edition has been updated with texts from the final translation of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal as well as corresponding texts and rubrics from the third typical edition of The Roman Missal. 70 Prayer Starters for Children and those who Teach Them (Book) Mathson, Patricia, Twenty-Third Publications, 2011. Seventy engaging and creative prayer experiences for children ages 5-10 that invite them to make prayer a part of their daily lives. It helps catechists pray with children in ways that speak to their lives and interests, including: talking to God in their own words, expressing praise to God through artwork, praying with scripture, remembering to pray for the needs of others, and much more. Fragments of Your Ancient Name: 365 Glimpses of the Divine for Daily Meditation (Book) Rupp, Joyce, Sorin Books, 2011. A devotional that heightens the awareness of the many names by which God is known around the world. Whether drawing from the Psalms, Sufi saints, Hindu poets, Native American rituals, contemporary writers, or the Christian gospels, Rupp stirs the imagination and the heart to discover a new dimension of God. Each name is explored in a tenline poetic meditation and is complemented by a simple sentence that serves as a reminder of the name of God throughout the day. (S,A)
