New Movies

Clare and Francis (1 videodisc, 200 min.) Ignatius Press, 2008. Filmed on location in Italy where the actual saints lived, this epic feature film, with the cooperation of the Franciscan Order, is lavish in its production, done with historical accuracy, and places special emphasis on the role of Clare.

Love is a Choice: The Life of St. Gianna Beretta Molla (1 videodisc, 52 min.) Salt + Light Television Productions, 2005. Documentary of the life of St. Gianna Beretta Molla with excerpts of the Canonization ceremony on May 16, 2004. Includes interviews with Pietro Molla and their children.

The Five People You Meet in Heaven (1 videodisc, 133 min.) Hallmark Home Entertainment, 2004. Eddie, an amusement park maintenance man and war veteran, ends up in Heaven after an accident takes his life. There he meets five people from his past: the Blue Man, the Captain, Marguerite, Ruby, and Tala. Each shows him how he impacted their life or they his--and not always for the better. Through them Eddie understands the meaning of his own life even as his arrival brings closure to theirs.

Following Jesus Through the Church Year: An 8-Part Liturgical Experience for Children and Adults (1 videodisc, 74 min.), Twenty-Third Publications, 2005. Intense search for the Jesus of History celebrated as the Christ of Mystery. Krispin is a detective who has been assigned to find Jesus. He makes his way through the liturgical year looking for clues but learns in the end that Jesus was present all along. A great introduction to the church seasons.

New Books

Go and Do Likewise: Catholic Social Teaching in Action Crosthwaite, Mia, Twenty-Third Publications, 2006. In clear, concise language, the author discusses each of the principles of the Church's social teaching and then offers a wide range of creative ways to live them: in five minutes, ten minutes, and twenty minutes a day. An excellent resource for both individuals and groups, for peace and justice committees, for RCIA teams, catechists, teachers, and parish ministers.

Signs of Life: 40 Catholic Customs and their Biblical Roots Hahn, Scott Doubleday, 2009. Provides a guide to the biblical doctrines and historical traditions that form the basis of forty Catholic beliefs and practices, covering topics such as the Sacraments, guardian angels, and the celebration of Easter and Christmas.

The Mass: A Guided Tour Richstatter, Thomas, St. Anthony Messenger Press, 2009. Father Thomas Richstatter uses simple, easy-to-understand language to explore and explain the Mass. The result is a guide to what the Mass means to our Catholic faith and how its different elements—the Introductory and Concluding Rites and Liturgies of the Word and the Eucharist—invite us to experience that faith more deeply and express it more fully.

Pope Benedict XVI : An Introduction to his Theological Vision Rausch, Thomas P., Paulist Press, 2009. A study of the theological vision of Pope Benedict XVI, with special attention to his view of Scripture as well as his Christology, ecclesiology, and liturgical theology.
