Still wondering why to encourage your youth?

Catholic Youth Organization summer camping offers a mountain top experience of faith for the youth of our archdiocese. Young people are guided by role models on fire with their Catholic faith to explore the work of God in their life through prayer, scripture and the sacraments. Dynamic adventure activities are used as metaphors for how we are called to fall deeper in love with Jesus Christ and to serve as He served, much like Jesus used parables to teach the crowds. The value of this experience is the ability for the youth to connect with their faith in a tangible way and to bring that back into their parish communities.

Your child's faith development is essential for them to develop as adults of strong character. This summer invest in your child's personal relationship with Jesus Christ and their connection to the Catholic faith. At summer camp, kids are excited about their faith because it is delivered in a fun, positive manner. The values you teach at home are reinforced through daily prayer, bible study and community living. Positive caring role models enable kids to see how their faith can be incorporated in to their own daily life. CYO camping also works hard to teach the campers that this feeling of the Holy Spirit alive in them does not have to end at the end of camp, but can be received through involvement in their parish.

Now you might be saying I really can't afford the cost of a week of residential camp or day camp. Camp is tax deductable as child care, making it equivalent to sending your child to a secular program plus CYO Camping is blessed with a large anonymous scholarship fund that can help you send your child to camp regardless of your personal financial situation.
