
# **Welcome to Convention 2012!**



This year's theme is Apps for Life: Faith, Hope and Love. We are excited to continue the long tradition of Youth Convention. This packet is designed to help you and your youth have a spiritually rewarding, and logistically manageable weekend.

Please review the entire packet, as many things have changed slightly including many of the necessary forms.

# Some new things for 2012:

## 1. Convention Website

# 2012 Basic Convention Information

## Who is invited?

Convention is open to all youth in 9th-12th grade. Adults who work as chaperones must also register in order to participate. It is important for those adults who work with your parish program to attend with their youth. Youth must be chaperoned in a ratio of 1 adult to 7 youth at all times.

# How do I sign up my group?

Visit the online registration site and register your group, or have your youth register themselves directly online. Parishes will still be billed for all youth from your parish. You will be able to see those registered from your parish at anytime by viewing a parish specific link that we will provide you with.

# How much does it cost?

## **Patron Saint**

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was born in 1656, a Native American daughter of a Mohawk father and Catholic Algonquin mother. When her parents died of a small-pox outbreak when she was only four years old, Tekakwitha was left with a disfigured face and fragile health. Missionaries came to her village when she was eighteen and she was able to learn more about Jesus Christ. When she was baptized she received the name Kateri, which is translated Catherine. When her village continued to reject her conversion, she had to flee to the Catholic mission near Montreal. There she received her first Holy Communion and took a vow of perpetual virginity.

She loved to pray in the outdoors, often making crosses out of sticks and setting up prayer chapels in the woods. She would kneel and pray for hours, even in the snow, so great was her devotion to Jesus Christ. She would spend long hours in the chapel with the Blessed Sacrament and attended mass at sunrise and sunset. Even though she was unable to read or write, she became intimately familiar with the stories of Jesus and was a beloved storyteller for the children. Many could see the presence of God in her, especially when she was praying. Kateri's motto was, "Who can tell me what is most pleasing to God that I may do it?" She lived this out by her continued service to the children, the poor, and the sick in her community.

She promised many of her friends that she would be praying for them in heaven. She eventually died at the young age of 24 due to her deteriorating health. A few apparitions and many healings have been attributed to St. Kateri since her passing, and even a few miracles. The Vatican has now recognized two major miracles due to St. Kateri's intercession. The second of which was in 2011 when one of this year's youth keynotes and his family prayed to Bl. Kateri and he made a miraculous recovery. As of October 21, 2012 we are able to call her Saint Kateri Tekakwitha.

## Reconciliation

Reconciliation will be available throughout the day on Saturday. Priests will be available all day for participants to receive the Sacrament. Saturday evening will not have as many priests available as earlier in the day, so please encourage your teens to attend early.

Passes will be distributed to each participant wishing to go to reconciliation. These passes will be good only for a specific period of time, and the bulk will be given out for Saturday afternoon. Please encourage your youth to request a pass early in the day.

# **AWARDS**

The following awards will be presented during Convention:

**Companions on the Journey:** This award recognizes adults who contribute their talents in outstanding ministry consistently over a period of six years or more. Nominated adults should demonstrate:

- Excellence in youth ministry as reflected in Renewing the Vision
- Commitment to on-going education and formation
- Longevity in ministry (6 or more years)
- · Commitment to young people
- Outstanding leadership at the local and/or diocesan level

**Diakonia**: Presented to parishes, high schools, or ministries whose youth have:

- Responded to the Gospel call to service as seen in Matthew 25:35-40
- Responded in Christian charity to the needs of the world or our local community
- Contributed an outstanding service to their greater community

**Saint Timothy Award**: Recognition for the Archdiocese to confer to a senior high school youth who:

- Lives as a disciple of Christ, setting a positive example for other youth
- Witnesses to their faith by exhibiting Catholic morals and integrity
- Demonstrates Gospel values through service to others
- Exhibits Christian leadership in parish, school, and/or community settings
- In addition to the St Timothy Award, two young people from this group will be selected to receive \$500 to the college of their choice.

# **Get Involved**

# **Lead Prayer**

Sign your Group up to lead a 5-minute prayer for Convention. Each year, the youth-led prayers are an amazing experience of Convention. Youth have led some of the most memorable and impactful prayers at Convention, and we would like you to consider this opportunity.

# **Participate in Mass**

For mass we need many people to volunteer for various roles. Please consider signing up your group for any of these roles or for any additional volunteer opportunities. More information on possible places to lead prayer or ways to participate in mass can be found in the parish leadership form below.

# **Host a Saturday Night Event**

This year, each event for Saturday night will be hosted by a parish, deanery or vendor. In order to host an event you need to:

- Select a room you would like to host from the list below, or submit another event for approval by October 1st
- Create a supplies list and submit it by October 15<sup>th</sup>. If OYYAM can provide the supplies, we will let you know by October 15th. If not, we will ask you find them in your parish or go without them.
  - o If more than one parish is sponsoring the same room this is much easier
- Arrange for your Chaperones to be in the room for the evening providing consistent adult presence.

# **Other Details**

### Banners

Each parish is encouraged to make a banner for Convention. This is an excellent opportunity for Convention participants to reflect on the theme for the weekend and design a banner depicting their thoughts and interpretation. BANNERS SHOULD NOT EXCEED 6 FEET IN HEIGHT OR 3.5 FEET IN WIDTH. However you can be very creative within these limits. There will be a procession of banners on Saturday morning before opening session. If you want your banner to be on display during Convention, please bring a pole and stand. Label your equipment so that misplaced stands and poles can be claimed after Convention. Please indicate on your leader form if you intend to participate in the banner procession.

### **CHAPERONES**

Each group will need one adult (over 21 years of age) for every seven youth at Convention. Chaperones pay the same price as the youth, and there are separate workshops set up for adults. Chaperone guidelines are included in this packet.

## CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

For those who need a certificate of insurance for the rental of a bus or property requiring proof of insurance by the institution of the Archdiocese, certificates can be arranged through Catholic Mutual at 206-382-3494. It is important that your request for certificates of insurance be made at least 3 weeks before Convention in order to assure that the certificate gets to you in time.

## HOUSING

The Office for Youth and Young Adult Ministry (OYYAM) will help facilitate sleeping arrangements in parishes and churches surrounding Bellevue College. If you require housing, please return your Parish Leadership Form requesting housing by October 15. Please feel free to explore options for hotels in the Bellevue area. NOTE: Housing for those OUTSIDE Snohomish, Pierce, and King Counties will have priority over those who are in the vicinity.

## FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION:

The Archdiocese of Seattle has funds available to assist participants who meet the following criteria: Participants must be actively involved in parish, faith community or school faith formation programs. The participant will be given a scholarship up to 1/3 of the cost of the regular registration rate. The amount of the scholarship will be based on family size and adjusted gross income. We encourage the parish to match what we are able to provide

Scholarships will be awarded to cover the cost of the on-time registration fee only. No scholarships are offered to cover the cost of meals, lodging or transportation.

## T-SHIRTS:

The registration fee includes the cost of a T-Shirt for each participant for registrations received by October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Participants and groups registering after 5:00 pm on October 22<sup>nd</sup> will NOT be guaranteed a t-shirt. Registrations received after midnight on October 31<sup>st</sup> will not receive a t-shirt at all. T-Shirts will be distributed with registration materials at Bellevue College or at the Convention Pre-FUNc. Be sure each participant marks his/her T-shirt size on the registration form. If no size is indicated the person will receive an adult Large

## PARKING:

Parking is available free of charge at Bellevue College.

### **MEALS:**

Bellevue College will offer a buffet on Saturday for lunch and dinner by presale only. Groups who chose to buy meal tickets for on-campus dining should contact Caitlin Chodzko for more information at 206.274-3129. Although we anticipate pricing to be similar to last year, we will not have final pricing until mid-October. Groups who wish to bring sack lunches will be able to stay in the Cafeteria to eat.

## Pre-FUNc:

Those participating in a Pre-FUNc will have an opportunity to start the Convention experience early. All registered Convention-goers are invited to participate in the free, optional pre-function on the Friday evening prior to Convention. Leaders can pick-up their group's registration materials early and walk right into Convention on Saturday morning.

Pre-FUNctions are events hosted by local parishes designed for youth to gather in prayer, praise and fellowship in larger groups prior to Saturday morning. These events are functional for both the community building aspects as well as the logistical ease of having everyone already onsite before Saturday morning.

If you would like to host a Pre-FUNc, we will be accepting new pre-Func sites this year. The expectations are to provide a place to sleep for your youth and those attending. OYYAM will contribute for some snacks (this is a limited budget) and provide logistical details associated with your parish. Please contact Caitlin Chodzko for more information.

# **Pre-FUNc Registration:**

Pre-Registration for the Pre-FUNc is required. Sign up for the Pre-FUNc on the Parish Leadership Form or the Convention registration form. The chaperone to participant ratio of one adult per every seven students still applies. Only groups will be allowed entrance into the Pre-FUNc, no individuals. After registering and shortly before Convention, you will receive location and directions to your designated Pre-FUNc.

# **Youth Keynotes**

**Apps for Life: Faith, Hope and Love** The theme for the 2012 High School Youth Convention speaks of the virtues as the apps for life. Throughout the weekend we will reflect on the transformative power of Jesus Christ's Love, our faith in Him and the hope of Christians. As a youth keynote, your job is to share a brief, three- to five-minute testimony on how you have experienced one of these virtues. To get you started, take a look at the following list of questions. Your keynote should try to answer one of these questions.

Tell us a story about...

- ...a time when you realized Christ's love for you.
- ...a time in your life when your faith was strengthened or renewed
- ...when you might have found Christian Hope in your life.
- ...you learned how faith, hope or love can transform your life
- ...how our culture defines hope and love and how you have experienced it.
- ...how you discovered God's love in your life and how it changed you.
- ...what you want versus what you ultimately hope for.
- ...how your love for Christ matches up with God's love for you.
- ...when you experienced transformation in Christ.
- ...how you responded to your transformation in Christ.
- ...how you seek truth in your walk with Christ.
- ...what it means to seek God's plan for your life.
- ...a time you experienced deep *praise and thanksgiving* to God and how you responded to that experience.

Once you figure out which question you want to answer, PRAY. Ask God to give you the right words to convey your message. Then brainstorm, write a speech with 2-3 key points, and practice, practice, practice in front of the mirror. Practice with family and friends. Practice in your bedroom. Time yourself to make sure you are between three to five minutes. Put something to simulate a microphone in your hand. Eliminate verbal fillers (umm, uhh, like, ya know), and replace them with silent pauses to create transition and make an emotional impact. Remember that you don't have to be perfect – just be YOU and tell YOUR story.

If you are selected to be a youth keynote speaker, a practice day will be planned with the other youth giving speeches. Each will have a chance to give their speech and receive constructive feedback. If you have questions, contact Bridget Harris at 206.382.4562 or Bridget.harris@seattlearch.org.

# Giving a Witness Talk (contributed by David Charboneau)

"Therefore, that I might not become too elated, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me." 2 Corinthians 12:7-9

#### What is a Witness?

A Witness is a short recount of how God has moved in your life. The purpose of a witness talk is to inspire and encourage, leading people into a deeper relationship with Christ.

#### Tips for a Witness:

**Christocentric:** even though you are telling your story, you are really speaking about Christ. It takes great humility to give a good talk. Remember: it is not about making yourself look good or making yourself look bad—it's not about you at all!

**Concise:** a good witness is short and to the point. Don't get bogged down with details; only tell those that move the story along. If your talk is too long, it will lose its impact.

**Avoid scandal:** Many good conversion stories involve rising from the depths of sin to a life in Christ. All Christians struggle with sin. No Christians need to hear the gory details of your pre-conversion drug abuse or sex life. Such details can actually lead others to sin. At the same time, people need to know that they are not alone with their struggles and that other have overcome what they are going through. The key here is *balance*. Speak about things that are applicable in general terms. This can be tricky and involves discernment. **Your youth minister should always know what you are going to share before you share it**.

**Honesty:** Don't make things up to make your story sound better. People can generally see right through a lie or an exaggeration, and will discount anything you have to say. God is amazing, and if you are focusing on Christ, you shouldn't need to make stuff up anyway.

**Connect**: your talk should connect to your listeners in a meaningful way. It should also tie in to the other talks, lessons, etc. A good witness is tailored to the audience and the situation.

#### How to give a Witness Talk:

Find out what the parameters: What is the time frame? What is the topic? What else is going on that night or at that retreat?

Pray about what God wants you to say. Ask for the Holy Spirit to assist you in your preparation and speaking

Write it down. This will help you keep on topic and finish on time (most people speak about 160 words a minute: a typed, double-spaced page is about 3 minutes).

Share your talk with the youth minister or another core member. Ask them to give you some criticism so you can fine-tune your talk.

Rehearse your talk several times—especially if you are not used to public speaking.

Right before you give your talk, pray.

**So, do you feel called to give a talk at Youth Convention 2012?** We can't wait to hear what you have to say! However, we have a few steps for you to follow in order to get yourself onto the stage:

- 1. After you practice, find a way to record yourself giving your talk. Make sure you state your name and parish before you begin! Don't worry about perfection because we will spend time with you before you go on stage. We just want to hear your story.
- 2. You will have an opportunity to practice your speech with our planning team as well as the other youth keynotes. Please make sure you are available on this date before you apply! If there is a conflict and you would still like to apply, please get in contact with us.
- 5. Come to Youth Convention on **November 2nd and 3rd!** We are excited to share in this experience with you!

# **Diakonia Award**

# St Timothy Award

On the occasion of the Archdiocesan Convention of Catholic Youth, the Archdiocesan "St. Timothy Award will be presented to outstanding youth from throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle.

In addition to this award, two young people from this group will also each receive a scholarship of \$500 to the school of their choice.

## The **requirements** are as follows:

- 1. The candidate must be a senior in high school.
- 2. Lives as a disciple of Christ, setting a positive example for other youth
- 3. Witnesses to their faith by exhibiting Catholic morals and integrity
- 4. Demonstrates Gospel values through service to others
- 5. Exhibits Christian leadership in parish, school, and/or community settings

To submit an **application**, a parish, faith community should:

- 1. Submit the enclosed application form. ONLY this form should be used. Each parish, faith community may propose ONE outstanding youth for this award.
- 2. THE APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE \$20 FEE. Applications received without the fee will not be considered. Checks may be made payable to "OYYAM."
- 3. Your nomination must be postmarked by October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2012. Any applications received after that date will not be awarded at the Convention.
- 4. In addition to the application form, the candidate should write a statement about him/herself on a separate sheet of paper.
- 5. Each nomination must be accompanied by the written endorsement of the nominee's parish, faith community, Director for Youth Ministry or other parish, faith community leader and must be signed with comment by the Parish Priest or Pastoral Coordinator.
