## U.S. Bishops Launch Spanish-Language Page On Facebook



The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), in an ongoing effort to more effectively reach Hispanic and Spanish-speaking Catholics, has launched a Spanish-language page on the social-networking site Facebook. The page, which can be found at <a href="https://www.facebook.com/USCCBEspanol">www.facebook.com/USCCBEspanol</a>, will feature a variety of updates from USCCB on news, issues of concern to the Catholic Church and faith-building resources. "Hispanics make up 16 percent of the total U.S. population, almost 40 percent of U.S. Catholics, and 50 percent of U.S. Catholics under age 25," said Bishop John Wester of Salt Lake

City, chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Communications. "It is critically important to engage this demographic, especially through the expanding field of social media, and provide them with accurate, quality information that encourages them to grow in their faith."

In a video message posted in Spanish on the new page, Bishop Jaime Soto of Sacramento , California, chairman of USCCB's Committee on Cultural Diversity, said the bishops "are grateful for the rich contributions of culture and faith that Hispanics bring to this country and to



our Catholic Church," and invited them "in a spirit of faith and kindness" to use the new page to "communicate and dialogue with us."

Content posted to the page will include the essay "Cosas Ordinarias, amor extraordinario: Mother Teresa and Latin America" by *TIME Magazine*writer David Van Biema, which depicts Mother Teresa's missionary work from Tijuana, Mexico to Chile. The author describes her work with the poor and how the Missionaries of Charity are established in 65 cities in Latin America. Additionally, photos will show Mother Teresa in her early years helping the poor and sick, her connection to Our Lady of Guadalupe and

Shrine in Tijuana built in her name.

USCCB has moderated an English-language page on Facebook at <a href="www.facebook.com/usccb">www.facebook.com/usccb</a> since 2009. It is currently "Liked" by over 40,000 people. The launch of the page coincides with Hispanic Heritage Month. Concurrently, USCCB's Secretariat for Cultural Diversity announced new statistics that reflect the accelerated growth of Hispanic presence in dioceses and archdioceses nationwide. States including North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Kentucky, Mississippi and Tennessee have experienced over 100 percent growth over the last decade, according to the U.S. Census. # Pope to Mideast Youth: Don't Taste 'Bitter Sweetness' of Emigration



Before a vast and enthusiastic crowd of young people in Lebanon, Pope Benedict XVI voiced a strong appeal to end the emigration of Christians from the Holy Land, opposing the trend that has decimated the native Christian population of the region and that is expected to continue to diminish it. The Pope concluded his second day in Beirut with the youth encounter, offering his own reflections after listening attentively to presentations given by a young woman and a young man.

The Holy Father began by telling the Lebanese youth -- and their guests from Syria, the Holy Land, and other places of the region -- that it is a "great honor" to live in the part of the world that "witnessed the birth of Jesus and the growth of Christianity. It is also a summons to fidelity, to

love of this region and, above all, to your calling to be witnesses and messengers of the joy of Christ."

The Bishop of Rome acknowledged the many difficulties that plague the region, such that young people face instability and lack of security, as well as unemployment. "But not even unemployment and uncertainty should lead you to taste the bitter sweetness of emigration, which involves an uprooting and a separation for the sake of an uncertain future," the Pope said. "You are meant to be protagonists of your country's future and to take your place in society and in the Church."

The Holy Father went on to offer some more practical tips, so that the "frustrations of the present moment" do not lead the youth to "take refuge in parallel worlds like those, for example, of the various narcotics or the bleak world of pornography." Regarding social networks, he said, "they are interesting but they can quite easily lead to addiction and confusion between the real and the virtual. Look for relationships of genuine, uplifting friendship. Find ways to give meaning and depth to your lives; fight superficiality and mindless consumption!" The Pontiff also warned of the "tyrannical idol" of money, "which blinds to the point of stifling the person at the heart." And he lamented that the "examples being held up all around you are not always the best."



Benedict XVI's address affirmed his hope for the future reflected in the youth, as he asked them to bring Christ's love to everyone. "Christ asks you, then, to do as he did: to be completely open to others, even if they belong to a different cultural, religious or national group," the Pontiff said. "[...] Experiencing together moments of friendship and joy enables us to resist the onset of division, which must always be rejected! Brotherhood is a foretaste of heaven! [...] Young people of Lebanon, you are the hope and the future of your country." ## Vatican Hopes Apple Partnership Will Spread Pope's Message



The Vatican has teamed up with Apple to develop new hi-tech methods for communicating the works of Pope Benedict XVI to the world. "It represents an enormous step on the international stage because, as you know, internet goes beyond space and time," said Father Giuseppe Costa, the director of the Vatican's publishing house Libreria Editrice Vaticana. "The message of the Holy Father will now be received in every part of the

world." The American technology firm will now work alongside the Vatican to produce eBooks and iTunes tracks of the Pope Benedict's weekly general audience.

In recent months the pontiff has used his weekly address to explore the theme of prayer in the story of salvation. His latest volume, "Prayer in the New Testament," is already available in print form. The new eBook format will be accompanied by illustrations from the Vatican's art collections. "The illustrations are of great value also in the electronic version as the reader can access the book as they like. They can zoom in and out to examine the images and compare them with the texts for their own personal meditation," Fr. Costa explained.



Initially the commercial agreement with Apple will only focus on the Pope's weekly catechesis. But the Vatican publishing house says that if this initial project proves popular, then more of

Pope Benedict XVI's extensive catalogue of writings could be offered electronically. Meanwhile, Fr. Costa promises that the new eBooks will be both "a beautiful art encyclopedia" and "a wonderful path of spirituality." With first editions already available in Italian, the U.S. bishops' conference is now collaborating with the Vatican to bring the same books to the world in English. 
### **USCCB** Resources to Assist in Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship




In a memo from Peter J. Murphy, Executive Director of the USCCB Secretariat of Evangelization and Catechesis, he wrote of the necessity of our Catholic community of faith "to respond to God's call to bring our convictions into the public square, to build a world that is more respectful of the life and dignity of every human person and to create an environment that is more fully committed to family, justice, solidarity and peace." In addition to the document *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, USCCB has prepared additional resources for principals, teachers,

catechists and parents. You are encouraged to share this information with your catechists and parishioners and take advantage of these free resources "in forming their consciences to be faithful citizens."

During election season, you will inevitably be asked questions about the Church's role in political life. To prepare you for such questions and to help Catholics form their consciences, the Catholic bishops have made available dozens of resources at www.faithfulcitizenship.org, including:



### In Thirty Years: Need for Community Will Still Be Here



USA TODAY celebrated its 30th anniversary on Friday and they interviewed some of the USA's greatest visionaries to talk about the world of tomorrow: How we'll live, learn and travel, what we'll do and who we'll be. In an article entitled *Longer Lives, Later Families and Greater Diversity,* William Frey, senior fellow at the Brookings Institution in Washington was interviewed. Here is a short excerpt that indicates the call to community will still be

important and we as a church will need to continue to evangelize but perhaps use some of what we learn in this call for the new evangelization.

What won't change: "People will still value something like traditional family," he says. "It may take different forms, but it's something people will aspire to."...The need for family extends to a need for community, whether it's a city neighborhood, a suburban cul-de-sac or a social networking website, he says.


