

The SAT[®] is reaching more students than ever—1.67 million students took the exam in the class of 2012.

The 2012 National cohort is more diverse than ever: SAT Participation and Performance:

- Females continue to be the majority of test takers, 53%.
- Racially, ethnic, and language diversity has increased.
- Course patterns are changing—more students are taking STEM (pre-calculus 52%) fewer taking social sciences (US Gov 59%)
- Public schools remain the majority, up a percentage point in the past decade, to 82%.
- 3 in 4 students will apply for financial aid.
- Nearly half plan to pursue advanced degrees, 52%.
- Health Careers are the most popular, but the SAT means don't support this choice.
- Grades are higher and students are getting more A's than ten years ago: 46% self reporting earning A's—41% in 2001. Average 3.36 gpa.
- In the past decade, Critical Reading has gone down 9 points, math is down 9 points and writing is down 8 points.
- **SAT** Fee waiver use is up. The SAT fee waiver service provides free registration for up to two SAT tests and two SAT Subject Tests. Nationally, approximately 1 out of 5 test-takers used a fee waiver to take the SAT in 2012.
