Garden of Money

Perspective: Making Good Decisions

Grades 3 - 5

Everything we have is a gift from God, even the money we earn. God wants to bless us with good things and its okay to spend some of our money on things that we want as long as we understand the difference between our wants and our needs and share with those who are truly needy. As in all things, the decisions we make regarding money should be a reflection of our faith.

Project

- Title the bulletin board; Stewardship of Money Making Good Decisions
- Subtitle with a scripture quote, such as suggested below.
- Create three sections; one each for 'Wants', 'Needs', and 'Offerings'
- Have the students draw or collect pictures from magazines, websites, clip art, etc. of items that would fit into each of the three categories.
- Option: Divide class into three groups and assign responsibility of one category per group.
- Place applicable drawings/photos/pictures in each section.


Suggested Quotes

Perspective: Anti-materialism

Grades 3 - 5

"What do you possess that you have not received?" 1 Cor 4:7

Everything we have is a gift from God. Even the money we earn from working hard is a blessing from God. We should not place as much importance on money - and the things it can buy – than we do on 'seeking God and His righteousness.'

What are the most valuable things in our lives? Do they always cost money?

Project

- Divide the bulletin board into two halves and title; What Has Greatest Value?
- Have the students draw pictures or bring in photos of their loved ones pets, too! Collect
 photos, magazine cut-outs or student drawings of tangible material items, such as flat screen
 TVs, cell phones, jewelry, fancy cars, expensive toys, video games, etc.
- Also collect photos, magazine cut-outs or student drawings of less tangible concepts, such as
 a family going to church or a child praying (seeking God), an athlete in action (strength and
 good health), children playing together (friendship), a beautiful ocean/garden/forest scene
 (nature), etc.
- Have the students place the pictures/drawings onto the appropriate half of the bulletin board; More Valuable & Less Valuable.
