Carl served as Executive Director of OFIS (Oregon Federation of Independent Schools) at the same time he served as the Executive Director of WFIS, and he cared so much about both organizations. He fought many battles on our behalf, while forging many new friendships and alliances.

I will remember him personally because he mentored me on how to care for the private school community, and about the issues that were so important to us. He taught me key lessons in effective advocacy, and if I do well at this today, it is because of all he taught me. He was a gentle man with a kind word for all. He understood those who had opposing viewpoints and appreciated the range of viewpoints that came to bear on critical issues. He always worked to find common ground with everyone involved in the education community, and worked hard to resolve issues in ways that everyone could support.

The freedom we enjoy today in our private schools, and the excellent relationships with education leaders (in and out of government) we have, were all initially forged by Carl. We just carry on what he started.

He became a personal friend, and we stayed in touch over the years, but less frequently as time went on. I still remember his words of wisdom, his words of support and encouragement, and his warmth and charm. Sometimes lost deep in my work for private schools, I actually hear his words and his laughter, and his bright viewpoint he shared despite the darkness of some of our tougher moments.

He will be missed, but more importantly, he will be fondly remembered.
