
Project


This example may be used independently or in conjunction with the 'Learning to Give' lesson plan titled 'Selfless Self Portraits'.

- Title bulletin board; We Are God's Beautiful Creation!
- Show the students several examples of self-portraits and portraits. (The 'Learning to Give' lesson plan, 'Selfless Self Portraits', uses the impressionistic examples of Vincent Van Gogh and Paul Gauguin.) Demonstrate the various shapes and differences among a variety of facial features.
- Working in pairs of two, have students sit across from each other and make a preliminary
 pencil-sketch of the outline and features of their partner's face. (The 'Learning to Give' lesson
 plan, 'Selfless Self Portraits', has student use mirrors to sketch their own faces.)
- Give students fresh paper on which to make their final drawings. Provide strips of construction paper for students to glue to the edges, creating a frame for their portrait.
- Display students' portraits on the bulletin board.
- Upon removing the display, have students make a gift of their drawings to their partners. Optional: In conjunction with the 'Selfless Self Portraits' lesson plan, when it's time to remove the display, have students present their self portrait as a gift to a loved one, close friend, or someone else who would appreciate having the student's artwork.

Project

- Use photos to illustrate each of these arts. Sources may be photos of (or from) the students, magazine clippings or downloaded online images.
