Called to Protect: Train-the Trainer
September 6 & 13, 2013

No particular educational background is needed to be a *Called to Protect* Trainer. Successful trainers may include clergy, religious, employees or volunteers, but they all share a commitment to protecting children. Teachers, counselors, case workers or health care professionals also make great trainers.

Qualities of a Successful Safe Environment Trainer:

- → Comfortable speaking/presenting in public
- Level headed when under stress
- → Emotionally and psychologically stable
- Compassionate towards others
- Reasonably objective about sexual abuse
- ♦ Comfortable discussing sexual issues
- Able to maintain confidentiality
- Motivated to participate in the program
- Current with Safe Environment training
- Willing to attend training updates

Approved trainers will participate in a two-day Train-the-Trainer certification that will prepare them to lead any of the *Called to Protect* trainings in parishes, schools or other archdiocesan agencies.

Called to Protect: Train-the-trainer is a two-day class and participants must complete both days in their entirety. Cost of training is paid for by the Archdiocese of Seattle. Lunches and all training materials will be provided free of charge.

Cancellations must be made within 24 hours of the training or the participant's parish or school will be charged a \$25.00 cancellation fee.

All trainers must obtain an endorsement from the appointed pastoral leader: Pastor, Priest Administrator, Pastoral Coordinator or Principal who must also sign the application. Application may NOT be signed by PAA or SEP Coordinator.

Clergy who wish to become a trainer must obtain prior approval from Archbishop Sartain.

Any individual interested in becoming a trainer for *Called to Protect* must complete the enclosed application and return by **FRIDAY**, **AUGUST 30**TH.
