## **Updates for Private Schools**

# Change in Minimum Instructional Requirement:

RWC 28A.150.220 Item 2a

Private Schools are not affected by the new changes in minimal hours. 1000 is still required. Most of our schools have more than this minimum.

## **High School Credits:**

Credits may be assessed by seat time or proficiency. No waiver needed. Schools should establish policy for judging proficiency.

## **Certificated Years of Experience:**

WAC 392-121-264

Teachers earn credit for years spent teaching in private schools.

### **Online Schools:**

Private schools' online programs should abide by the set of requirements established for their brick and mortar programs. The intent of the law is to create guidelines for approved private schools to run online programs if they so choose.

### **Handbooks:**

School Handbooks should address any new school policy changes made to address the same sex marriage law.

# **Early Learning News**

Thrive By Five, the state's nonprofit public-private partnership for early learning, has merged with the Foundation for Early Learning, a nonprofit that works to support kindergarten-readiness for young children.

Both organizations are influential and well-funded. This merger will unify their voice when speaking on behalf of early education in Washington State.

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# **Universal Preschool**

How do private schools' early learning programs fit into the plan for universal preschool?

Swift changes in the early learning landscape have yet to reveal how private schools that run early learning programs fit into the plan for universal preschool.

Some topics that have yet to be fully addressed include subsidies, curriculum, hiring practices, and quality control.

Our churches and private schools, both religious and secular, have been running early learning programs for a very long time. They understand its importance. They provide safe, inspiring and nurturing communities for our families and small children.

# Our political leaders need our help.

It is important to remind those who represent us in the legislature, the agencies with whom we work, and parents, that diversity in early learning programs is vital to the well-being of our communities, families and youngest students.

State sponsored programs are a good option, but not if they are at the expense of private schools.

# **New Private School Statistics**

Select Findings

### **Schools**

In the fall of 2011, there were 30,861 private elementary and secondary schools in the U.S., a decrease of 2,505 from 33,366 schools in the fall of 2009 (see table 1).

### **Students**

• An estimated total of 4,494,845 students were enrolled in the nation's private schools in the fall of 2011, a decrease of 205,274 from the 4,700,119

students in the fall of 2009 (see table 1). **Teachers** 

The nation's private school students were taught by 420,880 full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers in the fall of 2011, a decrease of 16,534 from the estimated 437,414 FTE teachers employed in private schools in the fall of 2009 (see table 1).
