# PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATE PROGRAM FOR ASPIRING CATHOLIC SCHOOL EDUCATORS



The Catholic Schools Department has partnered with Seattle University's College of Education to design a program of study leading to Washington State principal certification. This principal program will be cohort-based and is designed to meet the unique needs and qualities of Catholic school leadership in Catholic identity and faith formation, budgeting, and governance. The two-year, part-time program is tailored to meet individual needs with options for a Master's Degree, Post-Master's certification, or Educational Specialist Degree. Applicants must meet the Seattle University Graduate Admissions requirements.

Catholic school educators admitted to the program will receive a 50% tuition reduction from Seattle University. Program candidates will be responsible for the remaining tuition costs. Limited scholarship funds may be available through the Fulcrum Foundation.
