

First Green Receives Grant from Evergreen Chapter of Club Managers Association of America

In November, First Green was very pleased to be invited to the Club Managers Association of America (CMAA) – Evergreen Chapter -- annual meeting to meet with the club managers and receive a \$1000 donation. The CMAA Evergreen chapter actively encourages First Green programs at the clubs and is a supporter of First Green's mission. In early 2014, First Green will present an educational program on hosting field trips at one of the monthly CMAA meetings. Club manager support for field trips means that the golf course superintendent has more support, the club members are informed and included, and the resources of the club are fully marshaled for the field trip.

New Videos Available on the Website

As part of our 2013 <u>USGA grant</u>, we just created and launched two new videos. One is a general introduction to First Green, and the second addresses how to host a field trip. The videos help tell the First Green story, and also make golf course superintendents more comfortable with hosting their first field trip.

The videos were professionally produced over the summer by a team from Northwest Golf Media Association with coordination by Jeff Shelley, First Green board president. The production was funded with the USGA grant. If you are a teacher, show them to your principal and teaching peers. If you are a golf course superintendent, please show them to your club manager and club members. They tell the First Green story with considerable energy and excitement.

New Field Trip Lesson Plans on Website

First Green has developed a set of new core STEM* lesson plans that are adaptable for

students of different grade levels. Three *Math on the Golf Course* lessons and lessons on *Soils* and *Water* are now available on the First Green <u>website</u>. They were developed to dovetail with the resources in the superintendent field trip kit. The lesson plan activities have been part of many field trips over the past three years—many of you have already been involved in either doing the learning labs or seeing your students participate in them.

The plans give golf course superintendents step-by-step guidance for ease of use. And, teachers can see what will take place in the learning labs. In addition to the core lesson plans, you will see activity outlines on other topics such as *Golf and the Environment*, *Golf Course Operations*, *Plants and the Environment* and *Wildlife and Habitat Management*. Some teachers create additional questions for their students related to the learning labs and share these with the golf course superintendent in advance of the field trip. The goal is make hosting field trips an enjoyable activity for the golf course and the school.

School/Golf Course Connections

A total of 56 teachers signed in at First Green workshops and events this year to request connections to golf courses in their local areas. We have contacted the golf course superintendents and now are ready to email out the information. Teachers, look for those emails by mid-January so there is time for teachers to meet with the golf course superintendent and plan the field trip that will be scheduled for next spring.

If you are a teacher already matched with a golf course, don't let time get away from you. When you return to school in January, please reach out to your local golf course superintendent to schedule your spring field trips. Teachers and golf course superintendents - please let us know when you've scheduled your field trips so we can add them to our <u>calendar</u> and send a special package with handouts for the students – including colorful bookmarks.

In addition, by letting First Green know of your plans ahead of time, we can get a jump on drafting a press release about the field trip, so your local community will know which class and teacher visited which course.

If you can't find the contact information previously provided to you, <u>let us know</u> and we'll put you back in touch with your golf course or your teacher.
