What to Bring: Each room is simply furnished and comes with sheets, towels and soap. You will need to bring your own shampoo and other toiletries, comfortable walking clothes, a notebook & pen, and anything else that will help you feel comfortable and at home in the retreat center. A telephone and computer with internet access are available for use at the registration desk at the front door.

Meals: Our meals are served buffet style in our dining room overlooking Puget Sound. The retreat will begin on the first evening of your retreat with registration from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM (dinner at 6:00 PM) and end at 11:30 AM on the last day of your retreat. Special dietary needs can be met if you only make your needs known to our kitchen staff.

Directions: The Archbishop Brunett Retreat Center at the Palisades, overlooking the beautiful Puget Sound, is located just 4.5 miles from I-5.

From North or South I-5, take exit 143. Go west on 320th Street, past The Commons Mall. Stay on 320th until it ends. Turn right onto 47th Ave SW to Dash Point Road (WA State 509). At the end of Dash Point Road, turn left and then take the first right into the drive for the retreat center.

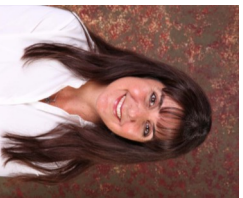
