GARDEN OF THE ARTS

Creativity is a gift from God and is manifest in every form of art. Stewardship of the arts includes recognizing that we have each been given a measure of this gift, and are called to nurture and use our creativity, as well value the creativity of others.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of the Arts

Do I take time to notice and appreciate the art all around me? Am I grateful for God's gift of artisitic creativity? Do I want to explore and develop my artistic creativity? Do I appreciate and support the creativity of others? How may I see God in the artistic creativity of humanity?

Scripture

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Do I nourish myself with a nutritious diet? Do I maintain a healthy weight for my body type? Do I exercise regularly? Do I receive a healthy amount of sleep? Do I care for myself when I become ill and see a doctor at the appropriate time? Have I considered programs or practices for my body's health, such as yoga, chiropractic sessions, exercise classes, regular walks?

Scripture

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body." 1 Cor 6:19–20

GARDEN OF CITIZENSHIP

We sometimes take for granted the blessing of living in a country in which we can share our opinions and speak our minds. We have the opportunity to vote and we have people who represent us in our government. We have a tremendous amount of influence when we work together as a city, state, or country. These blessings of civic participation and influence are gifts that we must use wisely.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Do I vote in all elections? Do I consider how my faith could influence my political decisions? Have I ever contacted a company to influence their decisions for a better world? Do I inform myself about political issues? Local, city, state, country, and worldwide? What political or social justice issues are most important to me? Have I ever contacted one of my representatives to influence them on any of these issues? Have I considered what small steps I can take to create a more just world? Large steps?

GARDEN OF CREATION

In our secular world, we hear much about taking care of earth's environment. But being good stewards of the earth and God's creatures on it has always been humanity's particular duty. God gave us dominion over creation – the authority and the responsibility to take good care of the physical world that He gave us.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

• Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of Creation

All creation is a gift from God, and we are all called to revere and respect this gift. The Church teaches that misusing God's creation betrays the gifts He has given to us for the good of all humanity. How do I revere and respect God's gift of creation? Do I keep myself informed about environmental issues? Do I allow concern for the world to influence my purchasing decisions? What simple steps could I take to reduce the impact I have on the environment? Buying reusable grocery bags? Lowering my thermostat a little? Have I considered supporting organizations that protect land, wildlife, and the overall environment?

Scripture

"The heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament shows forth his handiwork." Psalm 19:1

"The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it . . . " Psalm 24:1

"For by him all things were created; things in heaven and on earth . . . all things were created by him and through him." Col 1:16

"The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it." Gen 2:15

GARDEN OF DECISIONS

The opportunity to make decisions is a gift from God and a great responsibility. This is our gift of free will. Old Testament scripture shows a long history of God's faith community being called to make decisions – to follow Him and His ways, or to neglect God's ways, choose their own and suffer the consequences of those decisions. Similarly, we in the modern world are also called to make decisions that follow God and not that turn us away from Him.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

• Scripture

Wisdom shouts in the streets . . . "Come and listen to my counsel. I will share my heart with you and make you wise." (Proverbs 1:20)

Get all the advice and instruction you can, so you will be wise the rest of your life. (Proverbs 19:20)

Parishioner Meditations – Cultivating our Blessing of Free Will

Do I bring God into my decision making process? In my large decisions? In my small decisions? How does my faith affect the decisions I make in my work environment? Have I considered spiritual direction or counseling to help discern how God is leading my actions? Was there a moment today when God was challenging me to do something? Is there a significant decision I am being called to make in my life now? What part of my life do I try to keep God out of? How does this affect my decisions?

GARDEN OF EMOTIONS

Our feelings and emotions are an integral part of us as human beings. God calls us to deal with our emotions in ways that focus on healthy, positive thoughts and feelings, while avoiding the patterns of thought and behavior that may disrupt our happiness and well-being.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of Emotions

Do I recognize when I may need help with my emotions? Do I ask my family or friends for support when I need it? Do I pray and participate in the sacrements to seek spiritual help? Have I considered counseling during times of emotional distress, to help understand myself better and move forward? Is there a particular emotion I have that I want to understand or handle better?

Scriptures

"A fool is quick-tempered, but a wise person stays calm when insulted." Prov 12:16

"Sensible people control their temper; they earn respect by overlooking wrongs." Prov 19:11

"A wise man controls his temper. He knows that anger causes mistakes." Prov 14:29

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." *Phil 4:6*

GARDEN OF HISTORY

God calls us to understand our past and to use that knowledge for a better future. The history of God's people in scripture shows us the consequences of disobeying God, as well as the rewards of living according to His will. This history, along with all of humanity's known history, is meant to be used for our benefit, as a guide.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Scripture

"I will teach you hidden lessons from our past - stories we have heard and known, stories our ancestors handed down to us. We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the Lord, . . . so the next generation might know them . . . and they in turn will teach their own children. So each generation should set its hope anew on God, not forgetting his glorious miracles and obeying his commands." Psalms 78

Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of History

Do I appreciate that the historical past is a gift to be used as a guide? Do I take advantage of books, documentaries, and other resources to gain a perspective on history? Do I consider history, including recent and current history (news), critically – in order to apply its lessons to my own actions? Do I reflect on my own history and what I have learned from my personal experiences? Do I reflect on my spiritual history and the ways I have experienced Christ throughout my life?

GARDEN OF MONEY

A central insight of stewardship is that the material 'possessions' we have are not really ours. They belong to God, who has entrusted them to us so we can nurture, tend, and share them. Even the money we earn from our own hard work is a gift from God. How does God want us to use these gifts?

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of Money

Am I too attached to my possessions? What would I not be able to walk away from? Do I give 'from the top' of my material gifts, or from whatever is left over after I've spent on myself? Do I give financial support to local, national, and/or world charities? Have I pondered the value of my non-material blessings as compared to the value of my tangible poccessions? Do I trust God to meet all of my needs?

Scripture

"What do you possess that you have not received?" 1 Cor 4:7

"So do not worry and say, 'What are we to eat?' or 'What are we to drink?' or 'What are we to wear?' All these things the pagans seek. Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom (of God) and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides." Mt 6: 31-3

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth . . . For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Mt 6: 19, 21

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

• Parishioner Meditations - Cultivating our Garden of Relationships

Are there any friends or family members I want to spend more time with? Do I prioritize spending time with the people most important to me? Is there someone to whom I should tell, or tell more often, that I love? Am I willing to take risks to reach out to others? Do I listen carefully when my friends or family are talking to me? Do I have any unresolved issues with a

family member or friend that is getting in the way of me loving them, or of them loving me? Do I need to forgive anyone? Do I spend time in prayer for my friends and family members?

Scripture

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another . . . and overall these, put on love . . ." Col 3: 12-14

"Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Luke 6:31

"Serve one another through love . . . bear one another's burdens, and so you will fulfill the law of Christ." Gal 5:13, 6:2

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Mat 22:34-40

GARDEN OF THE SOUL

As people of faith, our ultimate desire is for our soul to attain the eternal life that God has promised to those who remain His sons and daughters. It is important for us to take time to care for our soul through prayer, worship, and actively maintaining our relationship with God. Tending to our souls should hold a place of highest priority.

Scripture and Prayer Meditations

Do I regularly spend the time I want to with God in prayer? Do I take advantage of liturgies, retreats and other opportunities to grow in my spirituality? Do I use prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to cultivate my relationship with God? Do I allow myself quiet time to just listen to the 'still, small voice' of God?

Do I use technology in my life to become a fuller person, according to God's will?
