Connected Toward Communion: The Church and Social Communication in the Digital Age (Book) Zsupan-Jerome,



Shirt of Flame: A Year with Saint Thérèse of Lisieux (Book) King, Heather, Paraclete Press, 2011. If you have not read Heather King before, her honesty may shock you. In this remarkable memoir, you will see how a convert with a checkered past spends a year reflecting upon St. Thérèse of Lisieux--and discovers the radical faith, true love, and abundant life of a cloistered 19th-century French nun. (A)

Redeemed: Stumbling Toward God, Sanity, and The Peace that Passes All Understanding (Book) King, Heather, Penguin Group, 2009. After decades of living on the edge, Heather King settled into sobriety, marriage, and a lucrative but unfulfilling career as an upwardly mobile lawyer in L.A. As someone who had reached middle age "never believing in much of anything," she quit her job and found herself in the last place she thought she'd end up: the Catholic Church.. she finds her faith sustaining her through breast cancer, a parent's death, the devastation of divorce, the perils and glories of writing. The remarkable journey of legendary football coach Bob Ladouceur, who took the De La Salle Catholic High School Spartans from obscurity to a 151-game winning streak that shattered all records for any American sport. Offers modest but genuine entertainment along with valuable, Scripture-based life lessons. The film contains brief bloodless violence, a few references to sexuality and a touch of mild scatological humor. The Catholic News Service classification is A-II. (J,S,A)

Mary of Nazareth (DVD) Ignatius Press, 2014. Mary of Nazareth is an epic motion picture on the life of Mary, mother of Christ, from her childhood through the Resurrection of Jesus. The film vividly captures the essence of Mary's profound faith and trust in God amidst the great mysteries that she lived with as the Mother

of the Messiah, as well as her compassionate humanity and concern for others, and the deep love that she and Jesus shared for one another. The movie underscores her special role in God's plan for our redemption, her unique relationship with Christ, and the tremendous suffering that she endured in union with his passion and death, as well as her serene joy at his Resurrection.
