May you experience the joy of this Christmas season and may the new year bring you even more blessings to share with those you love and with those in need.



A Contemplative Weekend Retreat January 29-31, 2010 **Introducing Centering Prayer**

This weekend will be a group retreat with conferences introducing Center Prayer as a silent, contemplative prayer practice. There will be time for practicing Centering Prayer, opportunities to share our experiences and ask questions, and to celebrate the Eucharist and Reconciliation. As we experience our interior silence, we will move more deeply into an environment of group silence. This retreat is primarily designed as an Introduction for those persons who desire to know and practice Centering Prayer and will also include presentations for those who would like to review their Centering Prayer practice.

Presentations by:

Sr. Joyce Cox, BVM, is the Spiritual Formation Director for the Palisades Retreat Center. She is a spiritual director, theologian and a developmental psychologist.

Kay Kukowski was invited by Fr. Thomas Keating in 1987 to participate

in the first Contemplative Outreach Ltd. Presenter Formation Program. She was in the first group of Presenters to Introduce Centering Prayer. Kay is a member of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish.



Mary Solberg is commissioned to teach Centering Prayer by Contemplative Outreach, the organization founded by Fr. Thomas Keating to renew the contemplative dimension of the Gospel in everyday life. Mary is active with the Contemplative Community at St. Michael, Olympia.

Theme: Often we see apparent obstacles on our path and we come up with some very good reasons and "excuses" for not moving forward. We have a tendency to wait for just the right time and right circumstance which, in fact, may never come. So, unfortunately, we let opportunities and life pass us by. But God is the one leading and calling us forward, despite all obstacles, despite the rain. Since God is the one in charge, and nothing is impossible with God, we need to trust God more and keep moving forward, learning to "Dance in the Rain."



Hospitality for Wildlife!

This beautiful Barred Owl was spotted several times last summer here at The Palisades. While it is primarily nocturnal, it was seen during the day usually along the driveway, sitting on stumps or branches. One time, it even perched on a car, just outside the office. These owls are known to live up to ten years in the wild, and feed off mice, squirrels, young rabbits, birds and fish, all are which are in abundance on our grounds.

We want to make sure that we maintain an environment that is welcoming to the wildlife. Many of you have probably seen the pair of bald eagles that are often soaring over the property. It is likely that they have a nest in one of our tall firs. We believe that the same pair of Mallard ducks has come back every spring for many years. One time, an otter even climbed the hill and walked right in front of our dining room windows. On our beach, a wide variety of gulls, herons and other water fowl make themselves at home.

Sam Keller, our grounds keeper, has taken several steps to preserve our natural environment. Just keeping the ivy from climbing up all the trees is a formidable task. He is interested in finding some volunteers who have some knowledge or interest



in forest restoration to help with his efforts to be a good steward of this beautiful property. This becomes all the more important as development encroaches on land that once was available to sustain the kind of wildlife that we find here. 
A Men's Silent Preached Retreat FEB. 26TH-28TH, 2010

Retreat Director: Fr. Patrick Howell SJ serves as Rector of the Jesuit Community at Seattle University. Since 1985 he has served in several positions at the university, most notably as dean of the innovative School of Theology and Ministry and as a pastoral theologian. Father

A Men and Women's Faith Sharing Weekend Retreat **January 22-24, 2010**

Rev. Stephen C. Rowan, Ph.D. is dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Portland, and founding chair of the Fulcrum Foundation. He has been a Professor of English and dean of Seattle University and interim president at Carroll College in Montana. For a period of time, Fr. Rowan also served as the director of continuing formation for clergy and was the principal architect of the formation program for permanent deacons. Fr. Rowan was ordained a priest in 1970.

Retreat Format: This is a group retreat with large group conferences offering formation in faith, times of silence and prayer. The retreat will focus on the works of Mary Flannery O'Connor (1925 – 1964) an American novelist, short-story writer and essayist. She was a Southern writer whose writing reflected her Roman Catholic faith, and frequently examined questions of morality and ethics.
