

Keynote - "They Went Forth: Bringing the New Evangelization to Life"

Father John E. Hurley, CSP



In May 2014, Fr. John E. Hurley, CSP launched New Evangelization Strategies. This national Paulist ministry, based at Old Saint Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco, will assist Pastoral Leaders, Councils and Staff, and Catholic ministries in creating a new paradigm for the sake of the mission entrusted to the Church and us as Jesus' disciples. Father Hurley has taken the Paulist charism to serve the Church across the United States and beyond. He has keynoted in over 80 dioceses across the United States and Canada, and he continues to speak on evangelization before parish, diocesan, and national Church leadership.

Father Hurley is the former Executive Director for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Secretariat for Evangelization, where he served for almost nine years, the National Pastoral Life Center in New York City and the new established Department of Evangelization for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. While in Baltimore, he co-chaired the first three Mid-Atlantic Congresses for Catholic Leaders. Since 2008 he is serving as a consultant to the US Bishops' Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis.

Father Hurley is a native New Yorker. He entered the Paulists in 1970 and was ordained in 1977. He graduated with a BA in Religious Education from the Catholic University of America, a Master of Divinity degree from the Washington Theological Union and a Doctor of Ministry degree from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley.

LIT-03 Living the Liturgy

We know that "the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 10). But how aware are we of the ways in which we participate with Christ, our high priest, in the sacred liturgy? How can we be more "actively engaged in the rite and enriched by its effects" (11)? Together we will deepen understanding of the mystery and meaning of the Mass, "the source and summit of the whole Christian life" (Lumen Gentium, 11).

LIT-04 Sing to the Lord

"Charity, justice, and evangelization are thus the normal consequences of liturgical celebration. Particularly inspired by sung participation, the body of the Word Incarnate goes forth to spread the Gospel with full force and compassion" (Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, 9). PA-02 Déjà Vu and the New Evangelization

Evangelization has almost always been a journey forward in past eras of crisis. Historically, the Church moved from attempts to evangelize in a time of Church-state struggles to the second Vatican Council which broadened the efforts of evangelization to society and defense of the human person. Today, an era seems to be dawning in which a variety of forces seek to marginalize and expunge Christian witness in both non-Christian and post-Christian settings.
