



Care for God's Creation

Pope Francis' universal intention for April 2015: That people may learn to respect creation and care for it as a gift of God. [Holy Father's Prayer Intentions for 2015](#)

Walking in Jesus' footsteps has two parts. One part has to do with knowing what is right and fair and then using that knowledge to find solutions to problems on a local, national, or even global scale. The other part has to do with showing people that you care about them by offering help and aid. To help children learn these important lessons, [Loyola Press](#), in partnership with the [USCCB Department of Justice, Peace, and Human Development](#), has created two story books. These books and accompanying teaching materials help children learn how to live as Catholic disciples and put two feet of love in action. (Loyola Press)



[Drop by Drop](#) (Book) USCCB, Loyola Press, 2015. Sister Mary Jerome's nephew Mike works for Catholic Relief Services. This is an organization that helps people throughout the world. Mr. Mike came to Sister's class and told the story of a village in the country of Burkina Faso, which is in Africa. The story is about a girl named Sylvie and how her village needed water. Sylvie is unable to attend school because it takes her several hours every day to collect the water her family needs. Sylvie eventually learns that her village has been chosen for a special Water Project. (P,I,J)



[Green Street Park](#) (Book) USCCB, Loyola Press, 2015. This is a story about Philip who loves his neighborhood. However an area of the Green Street Park is in need of improvement. Philip learns about how St Francis of Assisi loved God's world and cared for it. His teacher, Sr. Mary Clare, challenges Philip to act as St Francis would. As you listen to the story, think about how you would feel and what you might do if you were Philip. (P,I,J)

[The Church of Mercy: A Vision for the Church](#) (Book) pope Francis, Loyola Press, 2014. Pope Francis has captured the world's attention with his seemingly counterintuitive approach to leadership. Readers get a first-hand look at Pope Francis's vision of the good news of Christian hope and mercy. The book is a compilation of essays, speeches, and homilies by Pope Francis since his election on being a church that exists among and for the people, solidarity with the poor, and the need to demolish the idols of power and money. [One Human Family, Food for All](#) The "allegory of the long spoons" teaches us that when we struggle to feed only ourselves, everyone goes hungry. But when we focus on our neighbor's hunger, we discover there are ways to feed everyone. (Caritas International)

[Return of the River](#) (DVD) Elwhafilm LLC, 2014. Offers a story of hope and possibility amid grim environmental news. It features an unlikely success story for environmental and cultural restoration. Fundamentally, the Elwha River in Washington State is a story about people and the land they inhabit. The film captures the tenacity of individuals who would not give up on a river, mirroring the tenacity of salmon headed upstream to spawn. It is a narrative with global ramifications, exploring the complex relationship between communities and the environment that sustains them. The camera soars over mountain headwaters, dives into schools of salmon, and captures turbines grinding to a halt; as the largest dam removal project in history begins. The film features people and perspectives on all sides of the Elwha debate, reflecting the many voices of the Elwha valley. (S,A)



And there is no better Master Catechist than Jesus himself. This engaging and informative guide examines how we can become better catechists by following Jesus' example. Taking lessons from Pope Francis' [The Joy of the Gospel](#), [The General Directory for Catechesis](#), and the Gospels themselves, we learn how to draw people around us, speak clearly of the Father's love, and extend God's endless forgiveness to our students. We learn about praying for our students, and how to lead them to the brink of the paschal mystery, trusting in divine grace for the rest. An indispensable book to help catechists integrate Jesus' gospel message into the whole of their being. (A)


