Essential Religious Education Concepts

Week Six: The Creed A Statement of Our Beliefs [185-1065]

The Essential Concepts come from the Table of Contents for the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). They have been re-organized to fit under the Six Tasks of Catechesis. CCC articles numbers associated with each Essential Concept are listed throughout this document. Referencing CCC article numbers is a recommended resource for catechist preparation.

TASK 1 - KNOWLEDGE OF THE FAITH - Students explore, profess, and reflect on our Catholic faith, which is the content of God's revelation found in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition and lived out in the Creed and Church doctrine.

The Creed opens up the structure of the Catechism and shows how it is far more than a list of "faith facts," but instead a sure map for their journey of faith. For group or private study.

In order to effectively reach this generation with the richness and beauty of our Catholic faith, it must be done in new and relevant ways. Teens watch a staggering amount of media content each day. The VCAT Video Catechism does this through creative short films and videos that use cultural analogies, creativity, humor, and always try to answer the question, 'Why should a teenager care about this?' Seeds of Faith for Children Just like a seed needs the right things to grow -- water, air, dirt, and care -- your faith needs some important things to grow, like-Prayers - talking to God every day makes him happy and makes our faith grow-The Creed - it's what we believe about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit-The Ten Commandments - how to behave that makes us the best people we can be-The Sacraments - a big word for the special gifts God gives us when we love and follow him-Sacred Objects - holy reminders of our friendship with God.



A Well-Built Faith: A Catholic's Guide to Knowing and Sharing What We Believe Creatively developed around a construction theme-this book makes it easy for Catholics to know what they believe and to feel confident in sharing those beliefs. The book by Joe Paprocki follows the structure of the four pillars of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Creed, Sacraments, Morality, and Prayer), making it a wonderful resource for learning about and teaching the Catholic faith.

Essential Materials to Learn and Teach the Faith

Catechism of the Catholic Church Revised in accordance with the official Latin text promulgated by Pope John Paul II in 1997, the second edition now includes more than a hundred additional pages, offering such new features as a glossary of terms, an index of citations from sources and in-brief texts on core teachings. The essential

elements of faith are presented in the most understandable manner, enabling everyone to read and know what the Church professes, celebrates, lives, and prays in her daily life. The first new compendium in more than 400 years, the second edition of the Catechism stands, in the words of Pope John Paul II, as "a sure norm for teaching the faith" and an "authentic reference text."

United States Catholic Catechism for Adults/Study Guide for the U.S. Adult Catholic Catechism (Book, 4 part-36 chapters) Here is an inviting way to access the doctrinal and spiritual riches of the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, building your knowledge and your faith. Each chapter is designed to be used as a study session and includes: prayers, Scripture reading, a summary of the catechetical theme, its application in today's culture, citations of relevant passages from the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Compendium of the Catholic Church, questions for reflection, and suggestions for further reading.

Youcat: Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church Developed with the help of young Catholics and written for high-school age people and young adults, YOUCAT is an accessible, contemporary expression of the Catholic Faith. The appealing graphic format includes Questions-and-Answers, highly-readable commentary, summary definitions of key terms, Bible citations and inspiring and thought-provoking quotes from Saints and others in the margins.YOUCAT is keyed to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, so people can go deeper. It explains: What Catholics believe and why (doctrine). How Catholics celebrate the mysteries of the faith (sacraments). How Catholics are to live (moral life). How they should pray (prayer and spirituality). A Prayer Book and Study Guide are also available.

The General Directory for Catechesis The document that guides the Church on the ministry of faith formation. It originates with the Congregation for Clergy. From this ample work, national conferences, bishops, dioceses, parishes and their ministers derive guidance for directing the faith formation of believers. **The National Directory for Catechesis** A companion to the General Directory for Catechesis (GDC), it builds on some of the core themes of the GDC like catechesis's relationship to evangelization and worship.




