


War Room (DVD) Sony Pictures Home Entertainment, 2015. With great jobs, a beautiful daughter and a dream house, the Jordans seem to have it all. Appearances can be deceiving, however, as husband Tony flirts with temptation and wife Elizabeth becomes increasingly bitter, crumbling under the strain of a failing marriage. Their lives take an unexpected turn for the better when Elizabeth meets her newest client, Miss Clara, who encourages the couple to find happiness through prayer. Inside Out (DVD) Disney-Pixar, 2015. Splendid animated comedy, founded on strong values, in which an 11-year-old girl's personified emotions, principally Joy and Sadness struggle to help her cope with the crisis brought on by her family's move from Minnesota to San Francisco. Co-directors Pete Docter and Ronaldo Del Carmen prove equally deft at tickling and touching the wide-ranging audience for which their Pixar production is suitable. Fr. Augustus Tolton: The First Recognized Black Catholic Priest in America (Book) Liturgy Training Publications, 2015. Augustus Tolton, born into slavery, was the first black man to be ordained to the priesthood in the United States. Born in Missouri in 1854, Tolton spent his first years in slavery in Ralls County. After the outbreak of the Civil War in April of 1861, his mother led his family to freedom in Quincy, Illinois. Ordained in 1886, he returned to the United States and ministered in Quincy, then in Chicago. Tolton's cause for sainthood was introduced in 2011. His story, a story with great relevance for us today, needs to be better known. This graphic novel offers a way for readers of all ages to find out more about this holy man and learn to know him as a friend and an intercessor before God. (I,I,S,A)

The Abbey: A Story of Discovery (Book) Martin, Fr. James, Harper Collins, 2015. In his debut novel, James Martin, SJ, provides a window into the spiritual journeys of three people seeking direction. As he did in his previous bestsellers—Jesus: A Pilgrimage, Between Heaven and Mirth, and The Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything—Martin once again crafts a book that incarnates deep spiritual wisdom while being accessible and full of humor and grace. Through the characters' struggles, we see firsthand how God uses our worries, questions, and even anger to help us become whole. (S,A)
