The Name of God is Mercy: A Conversation with Andrea Tornielli (Pope Francis) Randon House, 2015. In a conversation with Vatican expert Andrea Tornielli, Pope Francis discloses the core of his papacy and, in his own words, conveys the great message of the Holy Year of Mercy. Pope Francis addresses each woman and each man on Earth in a deep, simple and intimate dialogue. Through his own experience as a priest and shepherd, the pope talks about Mercy, a subject of central importance in his teaching and testimony. He explains the reasons for this extraordinary Holy Year, and in doing so he speaks to all the souls - inside and outside the Church - who are looking for a meaning in life, for a road to peace and reconciliation, for a healing to their physical and spiritual wounds. It is the summing up of his teachings and papacy.

Pope Francis in the U.S.: Words of Mercy and Hope (Marianne Lorraine Trouve, FSP.) The visit of Pope Francis to the United States was a time of grace. Whether he spoke to an individual or a crowd of thousands, he showed us how to reach out to others with God's love and mercy, especially during the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy. Now those who wish to savor the most soul-stirring aspects of the Pope's journey can do so with this prayerfully crafted collection. Arranged by topic, these excerpts from Pope Francis' talks will help all believers reflect on his words and be moved to do what they can to make the Gospel and the works of mercy a strong force in their own daily lives.

Blessed Are the Merciful: Stations to Celebrate the Way of God's Mercy (David Haas) Clear Faith Publishing, 2015. Pause during this Jubilee Year of Mercy and make a spiritual pilgrimage of prayer and reflection to contemplate the mystery of God's healing mercy in these new Stations of the Cross. Over and over we encounter in these Stations of Mercy a gracious God whose presence is more powerful that our weakness. The theme of God's mercy weaves through our faith tradition. God never tires of drawing us into this gift of mercy spilled out and overflowing. Blessed Are the Merciful adeptly and creatively gathers a collection of songs, scriptural passages, psalms and meditation which celebrate and remind us that we are steeped over and over again in God's extravagant and tender mercy which is freely offered, freely given.

Ocean of Mercy: Three Lives, One Vision, No Limits (DVD) Ignatius Press, 2013. Filmed on location in more than 20 cities across Poland and the United States, it examines and chronicles the message of Divine Mercy in the lives and spiritual legacy of Saint Faustina Kowalksa, Saint Maximilian Kolbe, and Blessed John Paul II. Included are never before seen film footage, rare photographs, and extensive interviews with their friends, biographers, and family members.

Threshold Bible Study for Lent (23rd Publications)

People of the Passion Suffering seems to bring out the best and worst in our human nature. Some people are overcome with hopelessness that leads to despair; others are filled with courage that leads to heroism. The people of the passion in this book are the characters who participated in some way in the suffering and death of Jesus: Peter, Pilate, Mary Magdalene, Simon of Cyrene, the daughters of Jerusalem, and the woman who anointed Jesus.

Pilgrimage: In the Footsteps of Jesus Because Jesus entered our world in the human condition, our faith has deep roots in the physical places where he was born, walked and talked, laughed and wept, suffered, died, and rose again. Though a bodily pilgrimage may not be possible for many, this imaginative

pilgrimage unites these hallowed places with the sacred texts associated with the life of Jesus.

The Tragic & Triumphant Cross The cross is both the world's most contemptible instrument of punishment and the symbol of humanity's greatest hope. In turning this tool of torture into his followers' proudest boast, Jesus produced the most dramatic reversal the world has ever experienced.

The Resurrection and The Life What exactly did happen on Easter morning? Why did it impel the disciples to begin a journey which would transform the world? What does this mean to us, here where we live today? This book will help you understand what the Scriptures teach us about our own resurrection and how that hope gives purpose to everything we do.

Jesus, the Messianic King: Part One: Matthew (1-16) Matthew's gospel presents Jesus as Israel's royal Messiah, inaugurating God's kingdom in the world. It was written to help Jewish Christians understand that their faith in Jesus was entirely consistent with the faith of ancient Israel. With frequent quotations and allusions from the Old Testament, Matthew demonstrates how Jesus is both Son of David and Son of God. This study will help you understand the scope of this gospel, the clear advice it offers for the church, and its personal implications for the lives of disciples today.

Jesus, the Messianic King: Part Two: Matthew (17-28) The second half of Matthew's Gospel moves from the Transfiguration to the Resurrection, announcing Jesus as the world's true King. The life, death, and resurrection of Jesus bring the hopes of ancient Israel to their dramatic climax, linking Jesus' royal character to his humble service and self-sacrificing love. This study completes the unique portrait of Jesus developed in the first half of Matthew's Gospel and offers firm guidance for the Church and disciples today.

Pope Francis has called the special <u>Jubilee Year for Mercy</u> to begin Dec. 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception and the 50th anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council. It will close on Nov. 20, 2016, the day celebrated that year as the feast of Christ the King.
