Called to Protect Trainers

If your parish or school community does not already have a certified *Called to Protect* Trainer in your community, please identify someone to attend an upcoming *Called to Protect: Train-the-Trainer* session.

No particular educational background is needed to be a *Called to Protect* Trainer. Successful trainers may include clergy, religious, employees, volunteers or parishioners, but they all share a commitment to protecting children. Teachers, counselors, case workers or health care professionals also make great trainers.

Approved trainers will participate in a two-day Train-the-Trainer certification that will prepare them to lead any of the *Called to Protect* trainings in parishes, schools or other archdiocesan agencies.

Qualities of a Successful Safe Environment Trainer:

- ⊕ Comfortable speaking/presenting in public
- ⊕ Level headed when under stress
- ⊕ Emotionally and psychologically stable
- ⊕ Compassionate towards others
- ⊕ Reasonably objective about sexual abuse
- ⊕ Comfortable discussing sexual issues
- ⊕ Able to maintain confidentiality
- ⊕ Motivated to participate in the program
- ⊕ Current with Safe Environment training
- ⊕ Willing to attend training updates

There are four *Called to Protect: Train-the-Trainer* sessions this year. All sessions are two-day classes (9:30am-4:30pm) and participants must complete both days in their entirety. Cost of training is paid for by the Archdiocese of Seattle. Lunch will be provided.

January 26 and February 2, 2010 (Tuesdays)
April 28 and May 5, 2010 (Wednesdays)

All trainers must obtain an endorsement from the Pastor, Priest Administrator, Pastoral Coordinator or Principal who must also sign the application. Clergy who wish to become trainers must obtain prior approval from Archbishop Brunett.
