## The 7th Annual Private Schools Summer Conference Reaching All Students: Gifted, Struggling, and Students with Special Needs

Additionally, provided content and activities will lay the groundwork for implementation and sustainability of differentiated instruction through opportunities to use a structured collaborative process to evaluate data to inform future instructional decisions.*
