Does your inbox fill faster than it empties – on a regular basis? If so, your inbox must be like mine. During the hours of a typical work day, I am simply unable to answer all of the emails that require my attention. There are always several that require a personal response, many that I am cc'd and some that are "FYI" emails from vendors, colleagues, and educational / Catholic organizations.

I think I suffer from email fatigue.

It's an awesome communication tool but there are times when I wish for the return of the good ol' days, when mail meant ink, paper, an envelope, and a stamp. And yet, I like email because it supports immediate, inexpensive, and comprehensive written communication to send. However, it's not "inexpensive" to receive and read. I've been thinking...

If the average school principals receives approximately 2,700 work-related emails each year (15 emails/day for 180 days) and spends about one minute reading each one, it costs the school about \$2,100 for its leader to sit in front of the computer screen and scan emails (based on an average salary of \$95,000). With 74 schools, I am going to conservatively guess that we spend more than \$150,000 each year, reading email.

At OCS, we've heard from several school administrators that your email inboxes are full. And now that I see how much it costs us to read emails, I have asked the OCS staff to reduce the number of emails we send your way, which will hopefully reduce your fatigue and maybe, a small expense to the school budget.

Here's the plan: For January and February, OCS will commit to sending this Bi-Weekly Update and the monthly teacher's email to your inbox ... period. That's it. We'll continue to update the ocsww.org webpage on a regular basis, with OCS information as well as material from other Chancery offices and relevant documents to Catholic schools. The www.ocsww.org website can be accessed and reviewed at any time and I encourage all school folks to visit the site often. The OCS staff will also continue sending personal emails to individuals, as needed, but we will not be sending generalized emails more than every other week. At the end of February, I'll check in with the school leaders to see how we are doing and make adjustments, as needed.

So here is the Middle January Bi-Weekly Update. We'll send you another one at the end of the month. In the meantime, please don't forget to check www.ocsww.org for updates and announcements. .

E-RATE TASK FORCE

The schools should complete their requests for Internet grants in January. E-Rate also provides discounts on classroom network equipment and the Fulcrum Foundation has established a fund to assist with funding classroom network equipment. Several schools are candidates for 2017 Fulcrum Foundation IT Network Modernization grants. Tom has contacted the candidate schools and is assisting the school with the grant application. Looking beyond 2017, many schools are candidates for Fulcrum grants. Fulcrum is projecting their contribution to schools for 2018-2020 based on the 2016 technology survey and 2017 E-Rate participation is a prerequisite for grant eligibility so all schools are urged to register for E-Rate by the end of January.

TECHNOLOGY STRATEGY AND PLANNING

Several schools have reached out to Tom with student computer technology questions. One technical specification that should be strongly considered for all WiFi computers is IEEE 802.11ac Wave 2 WiFi radios network adapters. Wave 2 provides the highest possible WiFi network speeds. Many but not all computers have Wave 2 network adapters. Contact Tom for advice on this.

Your school may be planning to replace or add classroom network/computer cabling. A document has been created to provide schools guidance for all network upgrade projects.
