

Catholic high school Scholarship: Abbot Roth & Abbot Baran Scholarships

## Description:

Four, full-tuition, need-based scholarships will be awarded to the 2017 entering class by Saint Martin's University located in Lacey (near Olympia), WA. This is a need-based renewable scholarship for all four years assuming the student maintains minimum standards (12 credits a semester, 2.5 GPA).

## Requirements:

Students must attend a Catholic high school in the state of Washington. It will be a four year full-tuition scholarship for students who are Pell Grant eligible. Submissions of the FAFSA or WASFA will be required for students to receive the award. Nominations must be received by March 1<sup>st</sup> and interviews will be required in April with the announcement made by May 1<sup>st</sup>. Students must submit an application to the university and be admitted to be considered for the scholarship. The scholarship will focus on our four values and a student can be nominated in any of the four areas. The four values are: Reason, Faith, Community and Service. The high school can nominate the student or the student may self-nominate and select which value they feel is most important to them. Self-nominated students must also submit a letter of support from a school official at their Catholic high school.

## Responsibilities:

The Abbot scholars will be asked to contribute an average of five hours a week as a servant leader involved in service back to Saint Martin's. There is an expectation that students will live on campus for the four years they are attending Saint Martin's to provide leadership. Each year will incorporate different forms of service to Saint Martin's to positively impact the campus in the following offices:

1<sup>st</sup> Year: Office of Admissions 3<sup>rd</sup> Year: Career Development

2<sup>nd</sup> Year: Office of Campus Ministry 4<sup>th</sup> Year: Faculty of students' choice

## Application:

Nominations must be received by March 1<sup>st</sup>. Students can be nominated for demonstrating one of the four core values of Saint Martin's. The four core values are Reason, Faith, Community and Service. The high school can nominate the student or the student may self-nominate and select which value they feel is most important to them.

Interviews will be held in the month of April, with the announcement of recipients made by May 1.
