## **March 23rd Principal Meeting**

Recently, the OCS staff has been mapping our meetings for the 2017-18 school year. To forecast gatherings more than a year in advance, making certain that they are coordinated and consistent, is critical to maximize the effectiveness of our time spent together. As you well know, there are few things worse than leaving a meeting and wondering how you'll ever get those two hours back. In that light, OCS provides a meeting evaluation survey following each school leaders' get-together. The survey includes a Net Promoter Score (NPS), which we rely on to quickly assess the effectiveness of the meeting. Our January School Leaders meeting earned a solid NPS and the comments reflected that the 3 hour block (10AM – 1PM) was well received. Hence, we will be working with the same schedule for the March School Leaders' Meeting. My reason for taking the words to explain this is simple. #### **Low-Income Student Data Collection**

Now is the time to identify the low-income students in your school community. You will receive several resources from your regional Executive Principal at your next regional meeting, also hyperlinked here. These include:

Family income surveys in English and Spanish

<u>Low-income student list template</u> (to be completed after administering the survey)

<u>Instructions on how to identify low-income students using FACTS</u> (only recommended if ALL families at your school use FACTS for tuition management)

I strongly recommend that all schools administer family income surveys. Our data suggests that relying on FACTS Tuition Assistance Applications only captures 25% of the low-income students in the Archdiocese! It is critically important to identify these students so that we can fully take advantage of programs like Title I and E-Rate!!! am available to meet with schools and help create processes that will lead to improved identification of these students. Please reach out to schedule an appointment.

#### Changes to the Federal Title IIA Program & OCS Pooling

OSPI has confirmed that Title IIA allocations will no longer carry over, effective this year. Ask your school district when their fiscal year ends- this is the date by which you must use your entire 2016-2017 Title IIA allocation. The OCS is in the process of working with OSPI to pool unused funds for leadership professional development in August. All principals will receive a survey regarding their interest in pooling at upcoming regional meetings. Please complete the survey by April 15<sup>th</sup>.

## **E-Rate Task Force**

Two new schools have been added to the task force 2017 E-Rate cohort. Now there are 46 schools preparing to participate in E-Rate funding. Most schools received grants for 40% discounts. Several schools are working with the task force for guidance with upgrades to higher speed Internet access and considering fiber optic service.

## **Technology Strategy and Planning**

ITAG reviewed and approved all 9 school network modernization proposals at the 2/8 project technical review. An additional 6 schools will have project reviews at the end of February. The estimated total school wireless network equipment costs are estimated to be \$240K. The goal is use a combination of E-Rate and Fulcrum Foundation IT Network Modernization Fund grants to cover the entire \$240K cost.
