Teachers may contact and assign substitutes!

1) If you wish for teachers to have this privilege, direct them to access the AESOP training document (Click [HERE](#)) to view the video (Click [HERE](#)) to learn how to invite and assign a substitute of their choice.

All substitutes must sign out at the school before leaving, so the day can be approved in Ulti Pro. **No substitute approvals through the OCS.** We continued to get calls during the summer from substitutes who didn't get paid for working in your building. School Administration needs to be sure that the correct procedure is in place to pay the substitutes.

2) Substitutes have the responsibility to enter their hours into Ulti Pro before leaving the school for the day. The hours will be approved at the school and sent directly to Payroll. Please direct substitutes to the [web site](#) where information for using the system is available for them.

Forward a copy of all teacher /principal covenants to the Payroll Department.

Covenanted teachers are those who...

- Provide education for pupils assigned to their care in a formal and ongoing learning environment,
- Use lesson plans to facilitate student learning, follow a course of prescribed course of study (curriculum)
- Has duties that may extend beyond formal teaching, including accompanying students on field trips
- Have responsibility for student discipline, classroom management
