What Your Students Might Want You to Know

Listen to me. Learn from me. Be there, but give me space. SUPPORT Ask me questions. LET ME FAIL SOMETIMES. ZONGING, Ask, "What supports might help you?" acilitate friendships. Expect that I will learn. lan outrageously fun lessons. Always speak kindly. Ask, "What do you need?" If I am loud, be quiet. WHEN I AM HAPPY, Handle me with care. REJOICE WITH ME. Be gentle. Remember, I am a person first. Attribute the best possible motive consistent with the facts. Encourage interdependence. HELP ME CONNECT WITH OTHER STUDENTS. Allow us to create together, laugh together, and have fun together. BE TRUSTWORTHY. If Jam sad, Know I am unsure. Spark curiosity, wipe my tears. Be respectful. Do not control. Be a learner yourself. Let me learn with other students. Share positive stories with my parents. ASK, "HOW CAN I BEST HELP YOU? Set me up to be successful. Lead by loving. Be positive. V. STEP Challenge me.
