#### **E-Rate Task Force**

E-Rate is federally funded from the Universal Service fee on all monthly telephone service bills. Funds are distribute to help schools fund Internet service and Wi-Fi networks. School Internet service costs range from \$110 to \$4,500 per month. This is a table of the 2015-2017 annual Internet funds (Cat 1) and 2015-2017 classroom Wi-Fi network funds (Cat 2) and number of participating schools. Since the OCS E-Rate task force was established in 2016, the total E-Rate funds received by participating schools are over \$270,000.

Doesn't include the \$66K that non OCS E-Rate Task Force Team schools received.

The task force schools had 100% of applications approved by mid-August and ranks in the top 10% of approvals nation-wide.

Many schools have taken advantage of E-Rate Cat 1 discounts to upgrade Internet service speeds. Over 41 schools now have 100 Mbps high speed Internet service compared to 9 schools in 2015. This reflects an over 420% increase.

### **Technology Strategy and Planning**

Tom has completed a study of NWEA MAP assessment Internet traffic and discovered that starting up the MAP test can peak at more than 19 Mbps (using an E-Rate/Fulcrum funded high performance Wi-Fi network) at a small school. Previously, many schools only had a maximum of 20 Mbps speed Internet service. Upgrading Internet service to 100 Mbps has allowed schools to run MAP tests without impacting routine Internet access.



#### **Archdiocesan School Board Awards**

The **Sister Mary Taylor Award** was established by the Archdiocesan School Board in January, 1986 to recognize distinguished service to Catholic education by teachers, staff, administrators and those who have made outstanding gifts of their time, talent and resources in the service of Catholic schools. The award is named in honor of Sister Mary Taylor, SNJM, a well-respected teacher, administrator and Assistant Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Archdiocese of Seattle.

The **Archbishop Alex J. Brunett Award** was established in 2011 by the Archdiocesan School Board to recognize distinguished service to Catholic education by a pastor, priest or deacon. The award is named in honor of Archbishop Alex J. Brunett, in recognition of his support for Catholic education, during his service as Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Seattle for 13 years.
