## **PROTECT CONSCIENCE RIGHTS**

### YOUR VOICE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Background: In 2006, the WA State Board of Pharmacy proposed rules that would protect the right of conscience. However, in 2007, due to pressure by the Governor, Planned Parenthood and other abortion interest groups, the Board passed regulations that require pharmacies to dispense drugs like Plan B regardless of a pharmacist's religious objections to dispensing drugs that could cause abortions. Almost immediately a lawsuit was filed to restore pharmacists' conscience rights. The lawsuit is now on hold while the Board of Pharmacy considers re-writing their rules to potentially accommodate for the protection of conscience.

In our Catholic faith tradition, we hold that each person has the right to act in conscience and in freedom so as personally to make moral decisions. No one must be forced to act contrary to his or her conscience.
